Nancy Schulze is the Founder of the Congressional Wives Speakers in Washington, D.C. and co-founder with Vonette Bright of the American Prayer Initiative (AmericanPrayerInitiative.org). Her career path has taken her from New York City and show business to Washington, D.C. and politics via Montana where she was married to Montana's Secretary of State, Jim Waltermire, front runner for Governor at the time of his death in a plane crash. She later married Congressman Dick Schulze from Pennsylvania.

Mrs. Schulze has spoken at the Global Pastors Wives Conference, a national political Women's Summit in Washington, The Christian Women in Media Association, The Inaugural Prayer Breakfast for the Governor of New York, events at the National Prayer Breakfast, and events for Members of the US Senate, House and the Presidency.

Nancy's singing career has included galas honoring first ladies of the United States, the Inaugural Prayer Service for the U.S. Congress (televised), performances for ambassadors overseas and in the U.S. and principle roles in musical theater in the U.S. and on USO tours.
