We are accountable for our actions to our recipients, our supporters, our donors, and our fellow volunteers.


Please join with me in renewing your pledge of commitment to the core values of QOVF, and until next time, quilt in peace and happiness, knowing you are making a difference.

QOV "FLOAT" IN IDAHO PARADE

The "float" was a 1947 Lincoln convertible. Four veterans who had previously received QOVs displayed them from the car. Three more veterans were awarded during the special weekend.

Group Leader Lana Trout and Barb Crossler, a member of the historical society and DAR, coordinated the effort. Six additional QOVs have been awarded to Troy veterans since the summer event.
